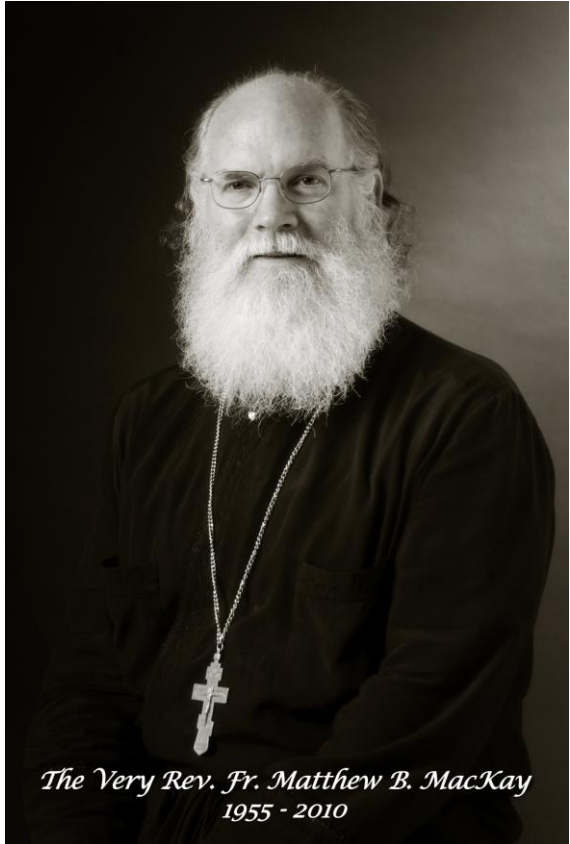


Psalm 90
